# our fees explained...

# 2026

Fees are determined by the College Council on an annual basis, although Council reserves the right to amend at any time.

## FEE BREAKDOWN

### Tuition Fees and General Purpose Levy

These fees provide for a broad range of academic services at the College. The fees also cover the provision of a device (iPad or Laptop dependent on Year level), academic aptitude testing, bus fares for academic excursions and sport, some textbooks, online subscriptions, student accident insurance, and College co-curricular activities (including registration fees, playing fees, coaching and most transport to and from activities).

### Subject Levies

Certificate and Distance Education courses may also attract additional fees. Families will be advised on an individual basis.

### Lunch and Morning tea

All students are provided with nutritious and chef-prepared meals at lunch and morning tea on school days. Meal fees are inclusive of GST.

### Boarding Fees

Boarding fees include food, accommodation, boarding activities, residential supervision, health and nursing care, laundry, facilities and cleaning.

Weekly and casual boarding can be arranged pending availability.

### Past Student Association Fee

A fee of \$165 per student for membership of the SCOTS PGC Past Students Association (PSA) will be invoiced on the first fee account for Year 12 students. This membership fee provides a lifetime membership to the PSA upon graduation from the College.

## DONATIONS

An optional donation to support our Foundation's Building Fund, Library Fund or the P&F Committee is included with fee invoices. Donations are not compulsory, and any support is greatly appreciated.

## DISCOUNTS

### Family Discount

A family discount is available if one or more siblings, normally living in the same residence, attend the College at the same time. The discount is 10% for the second child, 25% for the third child and 50% for the fourth and subsequent children. This discount applies to the Tuition Fee only.

### Scholarships and Bursaries

### Early Payment Discount

A 2.5% discount applies to fees that are paid annually in advance (prior to the commencement of the academic year).

### Referral Incentive

Current enrolled families who refer a new family to the College will receive a \$200 credit for use in the Uniform Shop once the referred student's enrolment is confirmed. The new family will also receive a \$200 Uniform Shop credit upon commencement.

## DUE DATES FOR 2026 FEE PAYMENTS

College fees are invoiced upfront each quarter and payable on the following dates:

<b>Term 1</b>	27 January	<b>Term 2</b>	20 April
<b>Term 3</b>	13 July	<b>Term 4</b>	5 October

Students in Year 12 will be billed over the first three terms of the year.

Other than in extraordinary circumstances and with the written consent of the Principal, no student will be allowed to commence a new term whilst all or part of the previous term's fees remain outstanding.

A late fee of 1.5% per month is payable on outstanding balances where no arrangements have been made with the Principal or the Business Manager.

## WITHDRAWAL OR CHANGE OF STATUS

Parents are reminded that should they wish to withdraw their child from the College, the enrolment contract requires that one full academic term's notice be provided in writing to the Principal. This written notice must be received no later than the first day of the final term of the student's attendance.

*Please note: One academic term's notice does not include any portion of a school holiday period.*

Unless otherwise agreed to by the College, in the absence of the required notice, tuition fees shall be payable in full for the term in respect of which the withdrawal is made.

If any fees or charges remain unpaid for more than six weeks past the due date, the College reserves the right to cancel the enrolment/s of the child/ren from the College.
